Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 9th January 2018.

1. Attendance:

2. Minutes from meeting of Wednesday 13th December 2017

The minutes were approved

3. Discussion on Parking on Course Road.

- 3.1. A discussion took place on the issues of vehicles, both commercial and cars, parking at the entrance to Course Road. Tom Zecca and Steve Dye described incidents when vehicles park across the entrance to Course Road preventing vehicles entering or leaving. They were advised by JC to use the 101 number to call the police who should ensure that a Police Officer visits to resolve the issue.
- 3.2. In a discussion on taxis NW agreed to discuss the provision of taxi ranks outside Rocksalt and Bar One in order to regularise the indiscriminate and often discourteous parking by taxi drivers in the early hours. Action NW
- 3.3. It was agreed that photographs of Taxis parking in the disabled bay and within the no-loading zone should be sent to Greg Nelson, Trading Standards and Licensing Lead so that his team could follow up and if necessary impose penalty points. Action Tom Zecca and Steve Dye
- 3.4. There was general agreement that the public including delivery drivers did not understand the fact that the red lined painted over the kerbs meant that loading and unloading were not permitted and there was a request that more obvious signs should be deployed. NW said that he would consider the request and report back. Action NW
- 3.5. Tom Zecca and Steve Dye advised that DPD, Parcel Force, Ups and SBL carriers were the worst commercial offenders. Both Tom Zecca and NW have been in contact with these companies who have allegedly advised their drivers not to park within the area.
- 3.6. The residents stated that there was no credible enforcement and in order to raise awareness of the consequences of parking within the area a more obvious presence leading to the issuing of number of FPN was essential. NW stated that the enforcement team visited twice a day but that he would arrange a presence all day on the 22nd January. Action NW

4. Priorities 2018 all figures relate to the period from the previous meeting.

All Burglaries (this includes domestic burglary, non-domestic burglary and theft from shed and garages)

4.1. **Burglary Dwelling** There were 2 dwelling burglaries in the period and the decrease from 11 in the previous period was noted.

Burglaries occurred in the following locations.

Redwood Drive where electrical goods were taken

Ringwood Close.

4.2. **Non-Dwelling**

There were 4 Burglary non-dwelling which included thefts from two shops in Ascot High Street

Llanvair Close where equipment was taken

Hurstwood where a car, garage and shed were entered.

4.3. **Theft from vehicles**

Once again theft from vehicles is high with 10 in the period which is roughly the same as in the previous period, 8 of these were across just 3 days.

The locations were;

- St George's Lane
- Horsegate Ride
- Queensbury Gardens
- 3 in Oliver Road where 2 were insecure.
- Lower Village road
- London Road Sunningdale where number plates were stolen
- Windsor Road.

GW will send out information to residents in his area asking them to secure their vehicles.

5. **Vehicle Nuisance**

5.1. There were no reports of vehicle nuisance.

6. **ASB**

6.1. LY and WE stated that calls were very low and it was reported that the only NTE incident was at the Piazza restaurant.
