4. Matters arising

There were no matters arising.

5. Local policing.

5.1. (LW) the officer responsible for Community Policing in Windsor, which includes areas such as Ascot and Wraysbury, stated that these areas are policed with a safeguarding team, Investigations team and community policing team. She stated that it was common knowledge that the police were under financial pressure and they had established a set of priorities to ensure that the police attended crime scenes in a structured way. For example, a crime in progress might be attended as a first priority. This meant that a theft from a car or van that was discovered some time after it occurred, and where there was a low probability of detecting the offender, might not be attended.

5.2. (LW) presented crime figure for the past year and the year previous which should no significant increase. (DH) stated that in the period October to December inclusive there had been 16 burglaries and 25 thefts from vehicles so the past month has been an exception, particularly for theft from vehicle.

5.3. Judy, Deborah and Lynsey explained that they, or a close relative, had been the victims of crime but despite making a call to the police they did not attend. The ladies stated that the crimes had a profound affect on them and as a consequence they felt unsafe

5.4. The spike in number of thefts from motor vehicles that had been well publicised on Facebook was discussed as was actions owners could have taken to ensure that valuables were not left in vehicles.

5.5. (RD) complained that youths who came to Broomhall Recreation Ground were uncontrollable. This was because the youths believed the police would not attend so there was no deterrent to their bad behaviour.

5.6. (DH) mentioned that the Borough employed a number of Community Wardens including Tracey Windle whose job it was to assist in combatting anti-social behaviour.

- 5.7. (RD) said that if finance was the issue Parish Council might choose pay for local policing.
- 5.8. It was agreed that the issue would not be resolved at the meeting but that it would be good to use it as a catalyst for change and that a further meeting should be held where the key points from the meeting;
- Lack of police visibility.
 - Lack of police response when a crime has been reported.
 - The fact that police are not visible means more crime is committed
 - A sense that the area is becoming less safe.

5.9. After meeting note.
