4. Matters arising

5. Local policing.

5.1. The discussion that started at the meeting held on the 11th February continued and covered a range of topic including;

5.2. There was concern that CCTV footage from residents was not formally followed up

5.3. Fraud, particularly against older people was mentioned and a suggestion that the police and PCSO could visit the lunched that are held at All Souls Church in South Ascot to provide advice to the older people who attend. This would include when to dial 101 and 999.

5.4. RD stated that she was most concerned about youths taking drugs in the wooded area adjacent to Broomhall recreation ground. In the main this was believed to be nitrous oxide gas which is supplied to the catering industry in small metal canisters. Inhaling the gas creates a feeling of euphoria but an also cause dizziness and other negative effects. RD suggested that young people who inhaled Nitrous Oxide might be more likely to climb over fencing onto the Railway lines.

5.5. Valerie Pike suggested that drugs were being sold at Broomhall.

5.6. RD stated that it was difficult to manage unruly youths and that in order to manage bad behaviour they must know that there is a local police presence.

5.7. MR stated that the police were keen to work closely with Charters School and that the school had provided a room that the PCSOs could use.

5.8. JP and MW stated that the police visit the school and give talks on a range of issues and that there had been searches for drugs at the school with police sniffer dogs.

6. Police Surgeries.

6.1. MR agreed to run regular police surgeries and it was agreed that these should be held in Ascot< Sunningdale and Sunninghill.
