5. Priorities 2019 all figures based on previous month

5.1. **Burglary Residential:** The meeting was advised that there had been 14 in the last 60 days 9 of which occurred in the last 30 days. The police have recovered a car that may have been involved in a number of burglaries. The burglaries were spread across the Ascot area and many took place between 7.00 pm and 10.00 pm. Items stolen were laptops and jewellery.

5.2. **Burglary non dwelling:** There were 6 in the last 60 days but all of these took place in the last 30 days.

The risk of burglaries increases as Christmas approaches and the Police will be manning a stall at Waitrose to raise awareness. They will also attend the Christmas Lights switch on in Sunningdale.

5.3. **Theft from Motor Vehicle:** 6 thefts from cars occurred in October, mostly from cars parked at stations, and 4 in November two from cars in North Ascot. The Police and community wardens continue to run the clear car campaign.

7. ASB

7.1. RD raise a concern about youths with nothing to do causing problems. She stated that RS and EM are reactive and although their support was valued, they displace problems. A proactive approach was needed that would provide alternatives to just hanging around.

7.2. RD said 14 to 16-year olds were not the problem as they were managed by the school. It was those 16 to 21 year of age that are the issue. The previous groundsman had engaged with this group and persuaded them to help around the Broomhall recreation ground.

- 7.3. HG stated that the Victory Field skate park was a facility that was highly regarded by youths.
- 7.4. EM and RS visit all ASB hotspots regularly.
- 7.5. A discussion took place on opportunities that might divert younger people from being a nuisance and RS described a programme that was set up in another area which worked with Youths on music and mixing music.
- 7.6. It was suggested that if something could be started local businesses my help with funding.
- 7.7. DH will talk to Danny Gomm who heads the Borough's youth provision to see what support may be available. And the activities that might be attractive.
- 7.8. RD said she would create a list of activities that could be developed.
