

Are there any rules on commercial vans (up to 1525kg unladen weight) being parked for periods of time in residential roads (without parking controls?)

There are no rules.

Are you moving house?

If you live in a Controlled Parking area or you are moving into a controlled parking zone then we may be able to help by suspending Parking Bays outside the property

- we need Fourteen days notice
- there is a charge of £20.00 per bay per day
- all suspensions are for 24 hours
- download an application form for [suspending parking bays](#). Forms are also available from the Customer Service Centre or by calling **01628 683880**
- forms must be returned with payment
- we will put notices on the street at least 48 hours before the suspension is due to begin
- we will ensure the space is free

Where and for how long can I park with a Disabled/Blue Badge?

- **On-Street Parking**
- Blue Badge holders are **not** permitted to park in Resident Only bays, Taxi bays, Bus Stops, Loading Bays/Zones and Clearways,
- Blue Badge holders can park in shared use bays (Resident and Pay and Display), On-Street Pay and Display areas and Limited Waiting areas for the maximum time as displayed on the signage present.
- There is a maximum stay of three hours in any On-Street disabled parking bay.
- **Off-Street Car Parks**
- Blue Badge holders can park free of charge in any Borough Car Park when displaying a valid Blue Badge. They must adhere to the maximum stated time for each car park as outlined on the Tariff Board. To avoid the risk of receiving a Penalty Charge Notice all vehicles must be parked within the bay markings.
- **Please note:** that vehicles displaying a Blue Badge which are parked causing an obstruction or using a badge in a fraudulent manner, will have their details noted and passed to the Thames Valley Police and the appropriate issuing Borough.

- Make sure the badge is displayed and all rules observed. You can also park on double yellow lines provided obstruction is not being caused.

Where can I park a lorry in Windsor or Maidenhead Area?

- The Royal Borough does not have any facilities for the parking of lorries.

White Lines

Borough's Parking Enforcement team we are now able to enforce parking restrictions where there is a dropped kerb leading to a driveway of a residence and a white line is on the road covering the opening to the driveway but they will only do this where there has been a complaint from the resident.

Pavement Parking / Grass Verges and Green Areas

If there are no signs and lines (yellow lines) on the road where a vehicle is parked either on the pavement/grass verge or green area, a Penalty Charge Notice cannot be issued. If the vehicle is causing obstruction it is a Police matter.

Except where the pavement is dropped to allow access, where there are signs and lines, the line from the road covers pavement/grass verge and green area up to the building line or fence. If a vehicle is parked as above a Penalty Charge Notice can be issued.

Can I park on double yellow lines to unload

It is permissible to load/unload or pick up/set down on double yellow lines, however parking attendants will observe the vehicle and if no activity takes place at the vehicle during a continuous five minute observation period a PCN will be issued.

It is not permissible to load/unload or pick up/set down where there is a loading restriction in force. This will be marked by yellow lines on the pavement and signs.

Can I park on the white zig-zag lines at pedestrian crossings.

It is a motoring offence to park on these lines and you are liable to a £60 fine and three penalty points if caught by the police. The Borough's Parking Enforcement Team may issue a PCN to cars parked on the zig-zag lines but in this case no penalty points will accrue.
